CSLA students opened the campus child care center, now known as the Anna Bing Arnold Children's Center, in 1968. We estimate that over 8,000 student families have used the children's Center services since that time. The Center currently serves 100 children per quarter. We now propose to build an additional four classrooms which will allow us to expand service to 250 children per quarter, include infants, school-age children, children with special needs, and evening child care. The increased fees are needed to support this program expansion.
