### **Referendum Information**

Since 1959, Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) has served as the official voice of students and provided services and programs that meet the educational, social, recreational, and cultural needs of the Cal State LA's diverse student community.

Currently, the annual student body fee is \$53.75 per student, payable \$26.88 in the Fall semester and \$26.87 in the Spring semester. ASI has not adjusted its student body fee since 1996. As such, our fee is the lowest of the 23 campuses in the CSU System.

#### Referendum, Children's Center and ASI History....

Cal State LA students opened the campus childcare center, known as the Anna Bing Arnold Children's Center, in 1968. Last semester the Center served 126 families, of which 50% were student families.

ASI first passed a referendum in 1988, which allocated to the Center \$1.50 per semester from each student's ASI student body fee. In 1996, with ASI support, the Center was expanded by the addition of four additional classrooms and the expansion of its services to accommodate more children (infants, school-age children, children with special needs, and evening childcare). In order to facilitate this expansion, a referendum was passed to raise the per student allocation to the Center to \$5.62 per semester.

ASI funding now constitutes about 7% of the Children's Center Operational Budget. Grants for low-income students make up 65% of its funding, parent fees 23%, and the University General Fund and IRA account for the remaining 5%.

ASI is proposing the current referendum to replace the per student allocation with a flat amount to be paid by ASI to the Children's Center each year.

#### Definitions:

#### For purposes of this referendum, the following definitions shall apply:

- Referendum: A general vote by the student body on a ballot question that has been referred to them for a direct decision
- from the ASI Board of Directors. To pass a referendum it requires 50%+10f the total votes cast during an election.

  - Referenda changing the student body fee with a specification as to how additional money is to be spent shall be binding on the Board for the first three years of implementation. After three years, referenda are advisory to the Board of Directors.
