_Teacher Academy-Bell High and Hollywood High and Community College Transfer Event _ Authored by Kenya Pineda and Lavernis Martin

I. Summary

Both events are a collaboration between CCOE representatives and the Charter College of Education. This semester, CCOE and the representatives have worked to create and launch our first Teacher Academy. The purpose of the academy is to do community based outreach and advocacy surrounding educated related issues and student success in higher education. The first event is a campus tour and demonstration of the Teacher Academy to high school students from Bell High School and Hollywood High, both of which have teacher preparatory programs for their students who wish to enter teaching. This is a time to explain the strong connection between what ASI stands for and how those qualities relate to education and to do outreach with high schoolers who potentially would attend Cal State LA from these feeder high schools. The second event us a Community College Transfer Event. This event is for students who come from community colleges who have been accepted to Cal State LA and are admitted to the Charter College of Education. This, once again, is an opportunity to explain ASI to future students and to support the Teacher Academy created as a collaboration between CCOE and ASI. This is an opportunity to do outreach to accepted students and support the work of CCOE.

II. Objective

Provide a learning opportunity for high school students in teacher programs interested in Cal State LA understanding of ASI, the Teacher Academy, and options for them in higher education. Offer an informational opportunity for transfer students to learn about their new student government and their support system in the Teacher Academy within CCOE.

III. Mission

The mission is to provide guidance in resources on campus for future educators and support for students in navigating higher education.

IV. Description

The money will provide giveaways and food. Giveaways will be provided for both events (high schoolers and community college transfers). The food provided will be for both events as well. Food provided for high schoolers allows for support of students who may come from low income areas. Food will also be provided at the community college transfer event for the variety of students, volunteers, and speakers.

V. Management

ASI reps and Agustin from CCOE will coordinate the purchase of items and food. These events are also still in the planning process of which CCOE ASI reps are involved in.

VI. Marketing

Agustin has connections whom he is coordinating marketing these events in their respective areas. For the high school that means advertising it to the teaching programs at the schools. The community college advertising is happening by working with advisors from the colleges who know of students accepted into Cal State LA and have an interest in education or related fields.
