1. What previous experience have you had in the area in which you are applying for?

The experience that I have for Chief Justice is the following: I have been in ASI since my second year at Cal State LA and have served as Associate Justice in 2016-2017. Currently, I serve as Xu HHS College Representative in 2017-2018. During my first year on campus, I had acquainted myself with the individuals (VPA, S/T, CRAL, VPF) serving during 2015-2016 and was informed of ASI procedures, policy, etc, through their experiences/interactions. Additional experience I have is serving on the University-Student Union Board of Directors, in which I also acquainted myself with the current serving board during my first year. I have served as a student member 2016-2017, during which I introduced my first amendment to the Board of Directors bylaws regarding eligibility and distinction between ASI and the U-SU Board of Directors, and after laying out my reasoning to the board, it was passed. I served as Vice Chair for 2017-2018 and have been elected to serve in 2018-2019, in which I have decided to run for Chair.

To clarify any possible misunderstanding, the Chief Justice serves as a mediator and a neutral party that holds no vote or seat on the Board of Director, but it is a conflict of interest for those serving any position within the the ASI structure to serve as such as well. Although the instruct the Chair on the proper procedure during business meetings they are not under the president but beside them as a separate entity. For U-SU Chair an individual is expected to attend committee meetings and also serve as a mediator to the topics laid out during business, while also serving as a neutral party.

In addition, I have also been taking a course called, "Introduction to Parliamentary Procedure: Dynamics of Leadership", offered through a partnership with the University of Wisconsin and the National Associations of Parliamentarians. Once completed I will receive the title of Registered Parliamentarian® (RP®) and be officially registered into the National Association of Parliamentarians. As I have served as Associate Justice, I have a good understanding of the bylaws for the organization and the duties of the Chief Justice, I have been reviewing the updated bylaws to be prepared if appointed into the position.

During the submission of this application I am still in progress of completing the course to receive accreditation.

2. State briefly why are you are applying and/or are interested in this position

I am interested in the position because it will help develop my understanding of policy and procedure. I will be applying to create my own interdisciplinary graduate program using research from Harvard on the topic of Political Anthropology which is a "contextual specificity of political processes, the mechanisms through which localities are incorporated into larger scales of social, economic, and political life, and the sentiments and meanings that people bring to their political practices." I aspire to enter government through an unconventional grouping of multiple disciplines to garner an out of the box way of thinking. My goal is to one day be a supreme court justice, but that is in the long run and I feel that this position would be a great experience to me and wonderful opportunity that will assist me towards that goal.

In addition, I am reapplying to dispel the idea that I am unreliable as well as the fact that my work ethic has been targeted. I pride myself in my curiosity and ambition, as well as resiliency and that was portrayed negatively after a vague explanation of one situation that pushed me out of my element and singularly affected my for a brief period.

I will continue this endeavor to prove that I am one of the best candidates for this position.

3. What do you feel are some of the major problems facing the students of CSULA?

There are many problems that students face, some of which I have seen and others that I have been through myself. There is a lot of resources that are not being used that are not known about, another is the cloud hanging over students about how they are going to pay for college, the tuition increase may have been delayed, but if the state doesn't fully fund us we're going to feel the repercussions and eventually an increase can't be fought by protest and numbers.

With the current presidential administration things have been unsure for our undocumented students and our students of color are also becoming targeted, reversing the snail's pace progress that has occurred in society and an increase in white supremacist thinking has been on the rise once again. The idea though is not what are the problems but what can be done to change it or what do we see that we can do. Something that can be changed that I have seen done at other CSU's, more so CSUN as I attended there my first year, is the digitalization of the advertisement for events. Even high schools have already started this and yet we haven't even begun to go that way. This could reduce use of paper which would be more eco-friendly and eventually reduce cost leaving room for funds to be moved into other areas besides advertisement. I know that there has been discussion and the issues brought up is cost, but that doesn't mean that eventually the digital advertising won't pay for itself. I think that another major issue is that administration is stuck with one way of thinking and they don't know another way so eventually it hurts students because our involvement with them is lacking. That needs to change more than anything else.

In addition, the lack of understanding towards the situations that students of low income must endure contribute to the lack of involvement of students on campus. I have seen this countless times as an Orientation Leader and the issue is that although we are a diverse campus, acceptance and inclusion of all cultures and views is lacking. Due to the targeting of singular factors that they have experienced which limits their opportunities, prevents them from moving

forward and seeing the big picture, I can say that as a campus we are hypocrites. The fact that we pride ourselves on our diversity but fail to actually make attempts to make all feel welcome and a part of the campus community is shameful to work towards that a foundation of a neutral understanding thought culture must be built.

That entitlement to ASI is creating a gap between the student body and ASI, that is something that needs to be addressed immediately. ASI members are students too and that seems to be something that is often ignored.
