

"The final version of the bill reflected a significant trimming, most notably in the enforcement arena. Nixed was a provision giving the Hawaii Civil Rights Commission jurisdiction to field student complaints and issue a right-to-sue letter against a state-funded education program. Instead, the bill commissions the state's nonpartisan Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a study over the next year of existing Title IX enforcement practices, review remedies that are available in other jurisdictions and spot any inconsistencies between federal law and other state policies." <http://www.civilbeat.org/2018/05/legislature-approves-bill-to-protect-against-sex-based-discrimination/>

 House Bill 2563: Free Expression policies This bill seeks to protect freedom of speech on college campuses. The bill mandates UA not restrict individuals on campus excising their free speech unless they engage in violence, threats, or disruptive behavior. The bill requires UA to create a committee to monitor free speech activities on campus and report to the legislature. The bill says any speaker invited to UA is welcomed and UA should provide for their security and take disciplinary actions against students who attempt to deny an individual their right to free speech. The regents have not opposed the bill but ABOR President Eileen Klein did argue sometimes efforts to increase free speech on college campuses by legislators actually inadvertently curtail free speech. Status: The bill passed the Senate 17-13 and the House 34-23 and is now awaiting AZ Governor Doug Ducey's signature. " <http://www.wildcat.arizona.edu/article/2018/05/n-legislative-round-up>

 Via Politico/SAHEC/APS: "A bill meant to boost free speech on campus that passed the Arizona Legislature includes a clause that says universities "may restrict a student's right to speak, including verbal speech, holding a sign or distributing fliers or other materials, in a public forum" - a late addition to the bill that has sparked outcry from conservatives and civil liberties groups. The bill originally said universities "shall not" restrict speech, but the wording was changed during negotiations between the House and Senate. Groups including the conservative Koch Institute and the Foundation for Individual Rights in Education, a civil liberties group, are urging Arizona Gov. Doug Ducey not to sign the bill into law. "
