1. What previous experience have you had in the area in which you are applying for?

In my high school, I was very involved in student organizations and committees involving community service and volunteering. I was involved in my school's Student Environmental Action Committee, and we met weekly to plan events such as trash pick up in our city, adding recycling bins to our community, and creating a student garden. I participated in my school's Envirothon, a program by the National Conservation Foundation. Envirothon is an environmental education program in which students partake in environment themed competitions. I competed with my school in the Science Olympiad for various scientific disciplines, with my specialty area being Earth Science. I was also involved in my school's Key Club and Homecoming Committee, and was active in event planning and organizing volunteer opportunities. Currently, I am an active volunteer for the National Association for Music Educators, and teach oboe lessons for the CSULA Honor Band Festival.

I believe I would be a beneficial addition to the ASI Environmental Policy Committee. I enjoy helping my community and being of service to my school and community. I am creative and have innovative ideas. I am very passionate about sustainability, and I would like to share my enthusiasm with the rest of CSULA.

3. What do you feel are some of the major problems facing the students of CSULA?

I believe the first step to living in a more sustainable way is simply becoming aware of the waste created in everyday use. Most students are unaware of how much waste is produced, and how easily waste can be avoided. Encouraging students to become aware of how much waste is produced, and simple ways to avoid creating waste, could make a substantial difference. Since CSULA is mainly a commuter campus, I believe student involvement is an issue at our university. I was surprised to find out there was no student organization or club, outside of the ASI, pertaining to sustainability and environment. I believe social media is a great tool to help students become aware of events of campus, and publicizing student organizations, clubs, and volunteer opportunities. I believe the food selection on campus has the potential to become more sustainable. The fast food choices in the food court are quick and convenient for commuter students, however, are also unsustainable. The cafeteria in housing is a healthier and more sustainable choice for food on campus. However, the cafeteria is isolated from the abuzz hub of campus. This makes the cafeteria inconvenient for anyone who is planning to quickly eat between classes, and commuters. The food court is at a prime spot on campus, easily accessible to students between classes. Having a more accessible cafeteria on campus would eliminate the use of excessive unsustainable fast food packaging such as: styrofoam, plastic straws and plastic utensils, as well as provide a healthier food option.
