





Building Design and Construction (51%)


• Goal: Certify all buildings completed during the previous five years at highest levels

Building Energy Consumption (48%)

Landscape Management (0%)

 Goal: Manage campus grounds with an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program, and without use of inorganic fertilizers and chemical pesticides, fungicides and herbicides

Food and Beverage Purchasing (0%)

 Goal: 75%+ of food and beverage expenditures on 3rd party verified or local/community-based products (3 pts), and limit purchase of conventional animal products (2 pts)

Sustainable Dining (82%)

Goal: Develop any of the following: 1)
 published sustainable dining policy, 2)
 source food from a campus garden or farm,
 3) host sustainability-themed meals, 4)
 health and wellness initiatives, 5) pre- or
 post-consumer composting program




Cleaning and Janitorial Purchasing (88%)

Office Paper Purchasing (40%)

 Goal: Purchase exclusively office paper that contains 90-100 percent post-consumer recycled and/or agricultural residue content and/or is FSC Recycled certified

• Goal: Make all vehicles in campus fleets alternatively fueled and/or powered

Student Commute Modal Split (49%)


• Goal: All students use more sustainable modes of transportation for getting to and from campus

Employee Commute Modal Split (27%)

• Goal: All employees use more sustainable modes of transportation for getting to and from campus

Support for Sustainable Transportation (90%)

Goal: Implement as 1+ of the following: 1) bicycle and pedestrian plan or policy, 2) bicycle-sharing program,
 3) telecommuting program for employees, and/or 4) programs to encourage employees to live close to campus



Waste Minimization and Diversion (48%)

• Goal: Divert 90%+ of waste from landfill through recycling, composting, donating or re-selling

Construction and Demolition Waste Diversion (92%)


 Goal: Divert all of their non-hazardous C&D waste from the landfill or incinerator

Hazardous Waste Management (50%)

 Goal: Participate in a program to responsibly recycle, reuse, and/or refurbish electronic waste

Rainwater Management (25%)

 Goal: Comprehensive rainwater management policy that incorporates green infrastructure, covers the entire campus, and mandate the use of LID practices

Participatory Governance (92%)

• Goal: Include non-supervisory staff members as elected representative on highest governing body

Diversity and Equity Coordination (67%)

• Goal: Have all students, staff, and faculty have participate in cultural competence trainings and activities

Assessing Diversity and Equity (63%)


• Goal: Structured assessment process addresses employee outcomes related to diversity and equity (e.g. pay and retention rates for underrepresented groups), and summary results are publicly posted

Support for Underrepresented Groups (53%)

- Goal: Program to support students from underrepresented groups for careers as faculty members
 - Program to recruit students, staff and/or faculty from underrepresented groups
 - Mentoring, counseling, peer/academic support for students, staff and/or faculty from underrepresented groups

Affordability and Access (80%)

• Goal: Increase entering students that are low-income (73%), graduation/success rate for low-income students (44%), need met for students who were awarded any need-based aid (68%), and/or students graduating with no interest-bearing student loan debt or for whom no out-of-pocket tuition is required (35%)



Investment Disclosure (0%)

• Goal: Make a snapshot of entire investment holdings publicly available, including specific funds and/or companies

Employee Compensation (35%)

• Goal: Total compensation provided to lowest paid regular employee meets or exceeds 200% of the living wage, and 100% of contract employees receive a living wage

Assessing Employee Satisfaction (50%)

• Goal: Increase percentage of employees assessed (50%) to measure employee satisfaction and engagement during the previous three years

Workplace Health and Safety (64%)

• Goal: Reduce recordable workplace injuries and occupational disease cases
