c. CARES Act Funding- The Board will consider taking action on the CARES Act funding Transparency Resolution from shared governance council.

- i. Diana Chavez: For those that attended shared gov Jocelyn presented the CARES Act resolution. The CARES Act money is federal money that is given to the Chancellors office and they were able to disburse that money to all 23 CSU's which Cal State LA received \$39 million in total and \$18 million was distributed to student support services and \$21 million went into institutional support services. The definition of institutional support services is still in question and many of us in students and faculty are requesting an itemized receipt or transcript of where the money is going and we have not gotten it and we are just asking for transparency. So this is just asking President Covino and the executive to make this public as it is mandatory and required by state law and they still haven't as other CSU's have already done so.
- ii. Jocelyn Vargas: I just wanted to add that it came about because there seems to be a lack of transparency where the CARES Act funding went and we never get concrete answers and they are always just delegated and beat around the bush so we want clear and concise information. I think that one of the concerns was that the budget was supposed to be posted September and we are now in December and I believe that one of my senators said that they met with Lisa Chavez yesterday and I'm still getting information on that and that is something that has been asked to the provost about the budget.
- iii. Carol Roberts-Corb: Lisa has been invited to come talk to you guys?
- **Diana Chavez:** I have talked to Lisa personally in that I also saw her in the resource allocation advisory committee and weren't provided any accurate answer in that meeting either so meeting after meeting we have gotten nothing, and we are making sure that Cal State LA follows the rules to make this public.
- v. Jocelyn Vargas: I just have a question for Carol, I know that one of my senators has told me that some of the CARES Act funding things have been published on the webpage but again no itemized list from what I am reading here, and it is not very detailed, so will that budget any time soon from what you know because from my understanding we are now a few months behind from that being published? Although I do appreciate that is something out there, but it is still not precise.
- vi. Carol Roberts-Corb: I didn't know that the budget was just approved so we all have been working on projected numbers and that might be part of the reason but that is more of a question for Lisa. I think it is more of a timing issue. I know to distribute emergency grants the federal government has placed several rules on how it should be distributed and there has been discussion on that.
- vii. Jocelyn Vargas: I think regardless if we pass this when it gets to the next steps I am sure Lisa will still come and speak about it but I would really would push for the Board to take action to have some form of accountability.

V. Discussion Items

- a. Outreach Ideas- The Board will discuss ideas on how to engage with the student body during remote learning.
 - i. Diana Chavez: We can now look back and have a discussion and talk about ideas and what are somethings that we can get our students to attend our events and meetings or for they can write to us and second what are we doing to get in contact with students? It is important that we get in contact with these clubs and orgs because a lot of the time information they are getting false information and not getting their sources.
 - ii. Lauren Diana: I think outreach is so much easier when it is not focused so much but more implemented in your habits whether it is class or the different clubs or groups you're in other wise I feel like we are just another thing that tells people what are the things we do. Another thing I found is an Instagram page that goes through this thing called loop chat and it has about 300 students and it is kind of like group me but for students and maybe it's just finding different plat forms. I think for Brajohn and I our Instagram page it was easy to repost different things and taking your personal account and sharing things with you friends and classmates so be unapologetic about reposting things.
 - **iii. Gus Salazar:** I want to share because I was in the meeting abut CSU and I want to share. The first they talked about is that on Instagram that a lot of campus do that whenever they post something they have staff or ASI members fill in the chat and respond to students and gives activity in the page and that made people stay and even follow. Another thing was doing an even on Saturday morning like once or twice a semester. Another thing they do is workouts in the mornings but the biggest one was sending out promo boxes and chico did custom built boxes that came from their engagement and it was for advocating and they said that students really enjoyed that and the only problem was the logistics and it very true but students do share on social where they got their things from which pulls a lot of people in. Some other companies were talking about selfcare packages or event packages to promote it. I shared the subscribe and win and they shared with me a lot of software like sprout and it actually tells us when it's the best time to host and it has a system that know the students and when it is the best time to engage.
 - **iv. Diana Chavez:** Thank you Gus, I am not sure about Saturday's and I don't know about working out. Just a friendly reminder that the holiday party is tomorrow as a reminder.
 - v. Analiz Marmolejo: I was just going to emphasize engaging more in the post so that students can see them in their timeline. Some recommendations that our group gave us is that they wanted to see memes on our page and more social media engagement and although I am not really into the tik-toks or things on our page I think we do need to stay more consistent on our ASI Instagram. If you look at the whole page it is was very personal and now a bunch of flyers and I don't think that is very interactive for students and its robotic so I think a great idea is like what Lauren and Brajohn did of creating videos welcoming students into their events so we can push for all of us to do something like that. So maybe we can do instead ASI takeovers which I think we have been pushing for that to give face to the reps.
 - vi. Diana Chavez: Thank you Analiz, I know that ASI presidents like for Cal Poly She does Latte's with Lucy in her Instagram account and updates the campus. I did mention to Gus that it is something I was looking into but it is such a hassle and I have never been tech savvy and making sure I look good and things like that but maybe I can do something with that.
 - vii. Ledi Loot: I was suggested, was creating a platform for students to meet from different colleges and giving out incentives and one thing I have noticed and we should be thinking about is mentorship. I went to the international student meeting and one of the questions I get to ask is how can we reach out to students right now and right now the only person they talk to is because I know most of the resources on campus. So I think if we make a program where we get to interact with the students especially the new ones because they are now just crawling in the dark because they don't get to have the experience of orientation and maybe Carol can help us with a university wide email for the new admits to invite them. Another thing is Podcasts or video via zoom or face book live and make a list of what we should be talking about. I also think we should do more videos like the one I did for the food pantry where a lot of students reached out to me.
 - **Viii. Brajohn Hicks:** Mine is really short and ties to something Gus said and it got me thinking because my friend has a yoga class on Saturday at 10 AM and she looks forward to it every week so thinking about it, that might be an interesting thing to look into.
 - ix. Dena Florez: Probably because it is not class related or work related and it's a me time and I was talking earlier with Lisa Chavez and we have this thing call admin hang out and there is no agenda and we just chat.
 - x. Diana Chavez: So, what I got are Saturdays not before 10 AM, but there are other great ideas as well.
- b. Resolution Ideas- The Board will discuss campus or external issues that the board can prioritize.
 - i. Diana Chavez: This is to help you guys in advocacy and what are some issues you make want to take up on?
 - ii. Ledi Loot: I think by now everyone knows that CSU released a statement of the possibility of students coming back on campus in fall 2021 so I think we should come up with something for student safety before students go

- on campus so there can be safety protocols must be in place maybe it can be the structure or required vaccines or something.
- iii. Jocelyn Vargas: Ledi I like that, and I have students sitting in the risk management committee, so I'll get more information on that. One of the biggest problems in my area are students in research lab are being severely impacted by all these regulations so for those who may not know right now only second year graduate students are being allowed into research labs which puts any undergraduate seniors or graduate first years extremely behind on research and the impact on that is that people looking into med school or looking into going into a different avenue of research post graduate because they are not accumulating the hours they need to be able to apply to knew programs and we have talked about it in the senate and there has been no formal response and faculty and students want to know because it is putting everyone behind at least in the college of NSS and other college. A second one would be in regards to communication in the Cal State LA webpage there are some information in there that is out dates and sometimes that can be difficult to navigate finding information as well as just communication from administration that we need to have. I know that the provost was attending the academic senate but it was only a limited amount of time to speak to the provost and recently President Covino came to the academic senate but he only presented and didn't leave time for asking questions and I don't know if he had a prior engagement but regardless I think that there should be an opportunity for faculty and students of the senate to be able to ask questions to our leaders and that's a second idea. The third would be black student enrollment and it is another ongoing conversation although there seems to be that there are programs that are helping in this issue, but it doesn't seem enough. Another one I don't know if this is a resolution or an internal ASI thing I know we are doing the food grocery packs but I was also thinking something other CSU's have done is something in regards to, toiletries with your basic necessities.
- iv. Sidney Lim: For my college we met with our program directors and it seems that faculty is struggling and the reason I bring this up is up is because the availability of faculty directly impacts students. Like for one of our BA programs there is only one full time faculty and she is serving as the advisor, coordinator, professor, and I think that is a lot and that spreads her time thin and it is a disservice to the students in the program. So if there is some way we can get some type of support for faculty and she will be going on sabbatical soon and that program would be left completely empty since she is the only one supporting that program.

I am also working with faculty in that we will be discussing well we presented to them the CARES Act fund transparency resolution so they want to second that. So making sure that the faculty is good as well and thanking them for passing the resolution in the academic senate. I am continuing meeting with meeting president Covino and again commencement is still up in the air. We were able to set and ideal date with Pizza with the President to get an opportunity to meet with him and then meeting with the college reps and working on winter training with Dena. There is a new peer program going in the center of academic success and there is an email that was sent university wide so you can be a sort of mentor.

 - i. Ledi: We have been making progress on the ED search committee so we got the two sets of the interview questions and starting January we will review applications. I also did the culminating with the social civic engagement with professor Seals and we are looking forward into another partnership next year so we can pass on some recommendations for the next administration and I forming another partnership with another faculty who will be trying to get their student engaged with ASI and all of our events. They will be writing stories about all of our events in exchange for credits. I have been following up with all the commissioners to ensure for especially spirit week and elections we will be meeting with campus partners. Last week I met with campus partners and the edible garden club so it's a combination of administration housing facilities and then the club itself and we granted them

some funding for the compost and we are on the process on what type of compost they should be utilizing with the amount of money they have and they are making progress seeing as they have water irrigation. Working on the holiday party for tomorrow and working with Dena and Gus.
