### III. Informational Items

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- a. Program Proposal for Spring 2021- The Board will be informed about the upcoming deadline for spring program proposals.
  - **Diana Chavez:** Just remember that program proposals for spring 21' are due November 20<sup>th</sup> and I've had some proposals already but there is a new link to submit those proposals. If you are one of the reps that has submitted a proposal for spring you would have to re-do it on the new link and not the link that you have access to right now so I do apologize and I will send the new link no later than today I'm just waiting on Gus for that. Depending on the exec expectations for college reps and my expectations for my college reps are two events so discuss those proposals.
  - Ledi Loot: I have one problem meeting the deadline with the other areas only for the spirit commissioner because the spirit week has to work with the university campus until now they have not said the schedule pf the meeting because they have not decided if they want to do the spirit week or not and I think we are meeting next week and I don't think we have enough time to have some ideas and we already have some but we need approval from them.

  - **Diana Chavez:** Every week there is a total of 2 hours you have to complete them and I know we are in struggling times but that does not mean you don't host office hours. Dena Florez: We did discuss this in the COC meeting that the bi-weekly's are very important for your state of affairs which will help you compile your state of affairs so that you are not sitting there and not know what you did for the last 10 weeks. This ASI we don't just sit here. We work hard and you are strong advocates and let the campus know what you are working on and you president uses your state of affairs and creates a summary and when that summary does come out in a report format we should send it out to all other colleges to show what we have done.

#### IV. Action Items

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a. 3 & 9 Budget- The Board will take action on the 3 & 9 budget.

Diana Chavez: Did you guys get a chance to review it?

Dena Florez: Okay we did go over this in the last BOD does anyone have any questions on any one particular area? Just as a reminder we did allocate funding to compost and OSD. However, those of you who sit on finance the comes out of line items of the current program line items so therefore as an overview your administration nothing major has really changed except that we did reduce for travel for administration and administration right now is just me and the student staff which will Amanda, Sithyna, and Kaina and as you all know Sophia was here until October 30<sup>th</sup>. Moving on at the student government area we went over this and we dropped salaries a little bit because there was an anticipated increase and due to the current situation we did not do that and student salaries did drop because at the time we are not going to replace one student assistant position which was Andrews position. In technology we did increase a little bit in technology because of the subscriptions that we are using. Student government travel for CSSA we did drop that and we decreased leadership development. Moving on to programs, clubs and orgs were allocated an additional five-thousand so they went from fifty-five per semester and they are using it to now sixty per semester. Program and advocacy was dropped, that's seventeen-thousand two-hundred. Marketing and advertising dropped a bit again we are not doing certain things but we are increasing in other areas. Book voucher was left at twelve and whatever is not used in the fall it will be used in the spring. Committee permits and vouchers, I know Jocelyn are going to be working on trying to get the fall ones taken care of as we are nearing the end of fall because some committees are no longer meeting. Scholarships, this is for spirit week hoping that it could be really big for the Raul Henderson scholarship because that would really help the students and its called a scholarship but we should call it a service award. We did not change anything in the university support areas and I know in the spring we are looking on how to better support the food pantry but they have already ten-thousand in there. Lets go back to that pink area, s we finish our 19-20 audit there was a surplus of fees in order to be very conservative Kayla has allocated 30% of that surplus to be added to this budget and you see that 10% of the 30 is going to reserve and the other 20%, is going to be used for events for college reps to ask for their additional money and any ASI area can have some of that seventy-four thousand. We need to put together a proposal and present it to finance and finance will. In addition to the budgeted allocated line items you can still have another event just propose to finance but keep in mind that Kayla is working the university support areas to see that we can support them. I know we will see project rebound if BOD approves it that will go. Think of it as a check book and the total proposal will be subtracted from that seventy-four come on we want to see those

## V. Discussion Items

a. Project Rebound Proposal- The Board will be discussing Project Rebound's proposal that was approved by the finance committee.

**Diana Chavez:** Project rebound is to support the higher education and successful reintegration of formerly incarcerated though the mentorship and living example of other formally incarcerated students, graduates, faculty, and staff. Making high education more accessible to the formerly incarcerated students to enhace their capacity for civic engagement, to secure meaningful employment. Ultimately making a stronger, safer, and more educated communities. It offers education in the admissions process and available degree programs. Additionally, evaluates academic records and provides guidance in admission strategies. It also proved personalized financial aid advisement as well as direct student support. Additionally, planning a housing project for future rebound scholars. This proposal is to get funding from ASI and let me show the part we need to look at. So, what they want for their organization is previously incarcerated students continue their education and due to current Covid-19 these students are facing financial barriers. This support should be used for bills and food and bring equity, inclusion and equality to the Cal State LA campus. They are requesting six thousand dollars from us and that will be enough for thirty-eight formally incarcerated students and they will each have three hundred dollars. We will only be finding four hundred and fifty of each grant and the rest will be coming

out of the project rebounds pockets. It was approved by the by the finance committee as we did have enough in our budget to provide for them and it is now here, and we are just discussing it and we are not taking action yet. Any questions?

## b. Advocacy for Student Fees- The Board will discuss advocacy efforts to lower fees for spring semester.

- i. Diana Chavez: As you guys know I have been working to lowering fees and once again I have met with Lisa Chavez and were are going over the fees that are most likely going to be lowered for spring and I was able to convince her into looking into one specific fee which is the RA fee this fee is used for traveling when students goes on field trips and obviously because we are online and they are pretty much restricted traveling I though why not lower that fee and I convince her into looking into that and I just wanted to ask is there any other fee I may convince her to lowering and I tried the health facilities. So, I want to open this up to the board to see if there is any other good points. I can bring up to her regarding a certain fee we can lower.
- ii. Analiz Marmolejo: What about the fee for the athletics?
- iii. Diana Chavez: The reason why we cannot lower that fee is because it's a fee that funds their scholarships for athletics so a part of the scholarship that they get has some of that money so if we do lower athletics fee we will be affecting our students more than we will be helping them. If we reduce the fee we will also be reducing their grant and that's something I wouldn't want for them.
- iv. Analiz Marmolejo: Yeah but I still think its not their whole grant and I think it can be reduced we are not asking it to be completely reduced in a way but maybe we can allocate some of that funding because a lot of these things are not being used for our students.
- v. Dena Florez: I just wanted to say Analiz that and Diana maybe you can confirm with Lisa Chavez does cover some of the grant but there are some things that the athletics department does need to be a part of like membership fees to NCAA and like similar to our subscriptions their fee is much like our AS fees.
- vi. Diana Florez: We also discussed the student success fee as some of it pays for CAPS and you know and CAPS services is not expanded to all students as we have found out earlier that out of state residence and international students that are being affected by Covid cannot receive teletherapy from our campus due to state laws and I mention that and she said no because it pays for advisors and we are currently understaffed and if we do that we will be most likely losing advisors. She told me that reducing the fee does not mean that we get the money back for whatever fee it is and the fees are covered by usually financial aid and if we do reduce the student success fee and reduce it that money won't appear in our bank. That's why I chose the RA fee because it would be the easiest to convince everyone to reduce the fee and she will be looking into that. She didn't like the idea either.
- vii. Jocelyn Vargas: Previously sitting in the IRA for HHS, they fund the children center and the people that work there. 1hr
- viii. Diana Chavez: Well I don't know if the college RA is the same as the universities RA. So maybe that is something I'll have to ask Lisa because the only thing that she mentioned was Model UN for poly sci students and I don't know what other major is it open to and Model UN does traveling and that might affect Model UN and the students that use it in the following semester. So, what do you all think about that?
  - Jocelyn Vargas: I think it is possible because in HHS when I was a rep they would fund lobbying for public health and social work and not even completely like those clubs that wanted to do that would still have to fundraise on their own. Another thing is we can promote the sub-funding that students get to use that for the upcoming year but I don't know how much help that would be on the impact next year. We can see maybe how much was given to these clubs by IRA to go on these trips.
- x. Diana Chavez: I know we have club funding but I do have a questions for Kayla but lets say in that scenario where usually the RA fee is able to fund all 25 students in that class to Washington and we do reduce the fee and only 12 students can go for fall and other still wants to go will we be able to fund that?
- xi. Kayla Misa: I'm not sure on what our funding policy is for that.
- xii. Dena Florez: Right now I think that the finance committee is not funding travel but they can attend virtual conferences and ASI will pay the registration but as far as travel we will not fund because the university is not funding travel.
- xiii. Diana Chavez: If we go back to normal for fall 2021and say we do reduce the fee for spring Lisa said that 12 out of 25 will be traveling when it use to be all 25 but because we reduced the RA fee now all 25 students wont be able to travel. So Jocelyn had the idea of funding the travel for the students.
- xiv. Dena Florez: The funding committee would only be able to give a max of three-thousand.
- xv. Jocelyn Vargas: I think we should figure out how they are funding for the students and go from there.
- xvi. Diana Chavez: She only mentioned traveling not paying for their food.
- xvii. Ledi Loot: When it comes to traveling I remember last time I brought around 200 hundred Cal State LA students to San Diego for the university just payed for the bust and I'm not sure for the others.

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- xviii. Dena Florez: One of the questions we should ask is does the RA fund roll over? For example, In ASI we have our trailer system. So, when the university collects the fees for RA and all the fees are not used does that stay with RA or does it roll back into the big fund and get reallocated again.
- xix. Ledi Loot: As far as I know it does.
- **xx. Dena Florez:** The departments we fund at the end of the year if they don't use their funds that all rolls back to ASI.
- xxi. Ledi Loot: It's the same thing for the university based on my department that's how it works.
- **xxii. Diana Chavez:** In the case that travel does happen next fall how will this work out. So, I think I'll talk about this with Lisa. So, should we reduce the RA fees?
- **xxiii.** Ledi Loot: One of the questions you should be asking Lisa in total how much is the budget allocated for RA to get a picture of how big or how small that is and at the same time how much in the previous did it cost and in my point of view as a health care professional I think that we will not easily go back to how things were. I think students will be strictly to travel.
- **xxiv. Diana Chavez:** I asked a similar question previously and she didn't have the answer so that's we are meeting up again. So, I am leaning the discussion to reducing the fee if no one else has any other comments.
- xxv. Dena Florez: I know we are looking at the RA because they are not traveling but right now. We have areas, departments trying to function. I mentioned a couple BOD's ago okay ASI for example normally we would not be spending extra money on postage every time we mail out packages we are reallocated fees to something else we didn't spend on before so look at that RA fee and you want to reduce it because students are not traveling but how else is that fee being used because we want to support students but those fees that students pay help other students so where do you find the balance. Just think of both sides.
- **xxvi.** Lauren Diana: I think we need to reduce are framework on since cutting fees seems problematic maybe increasing emergency grants and finding money to give back to them.
- xxvii. Diana Chavez: Keep this in mind that Cal State LA has the lowest because Lisa knows our demographics and that's why it's hard to lower it because they are already at the bare minimum.
- xxviii. Ledi Loot: It will always be hard to decide if they don't give is the breakdown and be transparent and give us an itemized list.

### c. Project Brainstorm- The Board will discuss ideas on projects they wish to continue for next semester.

- **Diana Chavez:** From reading your biweekly's it seems like everyone has similar events planned out. So, this is just for everyone to speak and maybe have a future collaboration of civic engagement with a college rep. I also noticed that some are you are mostly focusing on programing which is fine but maybe noticing from this semester noticing a specific concern that has been occurring in meeting or events so maybe making an event addressing specific concerns. So, start thinking outside the box. I do want to hear from everyone on what you are working on so seeing how that you guys have similar issues maybe there could be a collaboration.
- ii. Jocelyn Vargas: So, in my area one of the things we are going to be working on is the transparency resolution and start a draft on that and next semester we are going to be doing an Academic Senator town hall. Another I am having all my senators do is reach out to all the college reps so they can work collaboratively to find the issues that are happening in the colleges that way we can see what is happening.
  - Dena Florez: It all sounds great but if you are doing this and gathering college reps issues to fix then what would our college reps be doing.
- iv. Jocelyn Vargas: No, the senators will not be making events I meant more academic issues and creating surveys, so we are not taking any of the programming.
  - **Dena Florez:** The only programming that I know that ASI does is our commissioners but our college reps I saw several of them did a survey study, meet and greet, so what came out of those surveys and what was the consensus and did you take the results of those surveys to the dean and di you talk to them. Did you find out from your dean what events does the college gave going on in the spring and how can ASI collaborate with them in those spring events if they have upcoming. For the charter college of education I know that one thing that has to be done is that students need to get CPR certifies and I know we are social distancing but can we get creative to find a way to support our training because I know many of our teachers have to be trained because I know before that was a big event and it has been requested again as well to support funding so how can we do it. So, you have done your surveys so how are you going to make them into effect for spring.
- vi. Ledi Loot: What we did is we created a survey and I want to emphasize that one of our goals Is trying to reach out to as many students as we can and we have restrictions because we don't have access to university wide email. Why I am really trying to put focus on this is because of the upcoming student elections. If you have emails that you have collected in these events send them to me and I'll give access to the directory that you can use to advertise your events so if we help each other to build this mailing list we can increase our attendance. I was able to find the list of faculty members as well and we can ask them for a little favor. Another

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thing we plan to do for spring semester is things like bring out DJ amongst other things and we have been increasing our following on Instagram and if you have event do share. And we also have been helping out the food pantry as well.

- vii. Lauren Diana: It shouldn't not be this hard to help our students and reach out to them and maybe this can be connected to the spring semester like getting an ASI page up on Canvas something students have to use to go to class every single would be more effective because not everyone will sign up and I don't know if that is possible.
- viii. Diana Chavez: That is something you would have to talk about with a college dean or department chair to reach out to the professors to put something on their canvas page. I thought we have an app?
- ix. Gus Salazar: We had one, but we took it off. This is something id like to say I don't think students want another app unless it gives them a benefit or something that they are able to interact with other students and stuff like that then they would love it but if it's something just giving information then they won't really care but it would be impactful if it was something like that.
- x. Lauren Diana: So that's why I think that it would be good on canvas since they don't have to go out of their way to get it.
- xi. Jocelyn Vargas: I like Lauren Idea and the way my department specifically did it is they made a canvas page for the school of social work and they allow students to add any information for that. So maybe that's possible.
- xii. Diana Chavez: This is something I will bring up on our one on ones and I do encourage all the executives to talk about as well and one thing I do want to mention I think we need to collaborate with each other a little bit more and I know that's something we have not done before because of our areas are a little bit different and we are in remote learning so seeing how that will work like I know Jocelyn have the idea for Senators to reach out to college reps. I know the biweekly is about us and we are doing but I never really see about what students are saying but I do want to start seeing what are the projects that you are working on. So, I suggest meeting with your college dean.

## VI. Reports

a. ASI President: Diana Chavez

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Diana: I met with Lisa Chavez to discuss fees and I will be reconvening with her and I met with Covino about commencement and there most likely won't be one, but it is still up in the air. Three ASI presidents already said no some are still discussing it. We are still discussing it but from what I am getting it seems like a no. Maybe graduation care packages? I'll probably push that. I met with the resource advisement consultation to discuss the CARES act money of where the cares act money should go to which we discussed in a previous meeting and I was not expecting this. We have received roughly 38 million dollars and 18.9 million was allocated for students. This is what the people want to see an itemized report and I did not know this but 21 million was strictly for institutional support meaning that its like IT support, virtual support, so I was under the impression that this left over money could have gone back to students and it cannot but I know in the late spring when we received our packages they only used 17 million so there is still one million that they have still have not distributed but I think it was Jocelyn someone in Facebook from the Cal State LA book exchange received some type of money and I don't know if it is from that and that is something I'll be asking. In the institutional support, I was under the impression that this meeting will dictate how much money will be allocated and the numbers were already set and it was up to the committee to accept or confirm those numbers. To start \$52 thousand went to subsidizing food services to reduce density in eating facilities, to provide prepackaged meals to accommodate social distancing and it is sort of a reimbursement type thing. So, all the money that the university is spending because of going online this CARES act funding to institutional support is a reimbursement for all the money that the university is spending.

- b. ASI Vice President for Administration: Ma Ledi Ham Loot
  - Ledi: My goal for spring semester is to have an ED by spring semester so I already have a complete committee for the search committee and so we are going to start to meet next

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week so we are just waiting for the approval to start hiring. I have worked with my commissioners to start working with their spring events. The environmental commissioner and housing commissioner are working with the edible garden club to insure that there will be another workshop and we just submitted that event proposal for composting. Next, I talked to Gus and Dena about delaying the application for student elections because we don't want to confuse the students about the presidential elections so we are thinking of opening it up in November 16 and please if you have friends if they are interested to apply or if you are staying for next year and since there will be no commencement why don't we do our own graduation drive by.

- ii. Diana Chavez: I don't think we will be able to do that.
- iii. Dena Florez: Maybe we can suggest not a big event but students can still have the experience of the walk and it is up to each students to do that and as far as ASI what we did last year we allocated funding to your grad regalia and we reimburse you up to \$80 for that and I encourage that.
- iv. Ledi Loot: What I was thinking is you know that there's a curve outside of student unions and just do a drive by to come and take pictures. So that's it for my report.
- c. ASI Vice President for Finance: Kayla Misa

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- Kayla: I have been in contact with the library and I am waiting for an email back to see how ASI can support them right now. I also have been in contact with project rebound so I am trying to set up a meeting with them as well and I am also working on another project but I cannot disclose that information right now.
