C. Spring Programming Calendar Draft

River: Discussed with the Committee about the calendar draft, events Include Eddie Fest (April 30th), Gold & Iron Grad (April 9th), Homecoming (date In February), Black History Month (date In February), Earth Week (April 22nd), ASI & U-SU Elections (March-April session)
