♣ Add language about accessing cabinet funds

- o Encourages co-college activities
- o Having concrete language to set precedence
- o Individual colleges access cabinet money by writing a proposal to be reviewed by the committee
- Language to include
  - o Chair can call emergency meetings
  - o Proposal needed for events costing over a certain amount
    - 1/6th of the current cabinet money allocated at the beginning of the academic year
  - o Less than that amount just needs to come to the Cabinet as an information item

## b. Discussion Item: Shared Governance Council Policy 023

Policy changes address relationship (or lack thereof) between academic senators and college reps

- **Litem 3.4.** 
  - o States that college specific committees will be handled by college reps
  - o College reps will keep tabs of students who sit on committees, collect reports, and review them before submission to VPAG
  - o A concern was brought up that some college reps will have more work because they have more college specific committees
    - Still ultimately a responsibility of VPAG
    - Items 4. states that if college reps feel overwhelmed, the job can be deferred to the VPAG
  - o A pro is that students feel comfortable talking to a student within their college
  - o College reps should be encouraged to join college specific committees
    - Need to strengthen one external committee requirement
    - To become experts in their colleges
  - o Added language to give college reps a more active role in recruiting for college specific committees
  - A concern was brought up about ASI members taking up spots for students
    - Increase in student spots on college committees
  - o A concern was brought up about inactive students on committees
    - Normally professors recruit the students to sit on committees
    - It is the job of the VPAG to make sure students are active
  - Clarification on committee reports
    - College reps review them before they get sent to VPAG (unless the college rep doesn't have time)
  - o A concern was brought up about the need for training for college reps on overseeing people

- Would probably be included in the summer
- o Want to form a closer relationship with VPAG
  - Office of collegiate collaboration committee to sit in Cabinet
- o A concern was brought up about what it means to oversee people
  - This point in addition to reading college specific reports should be included in college represponsibilities
    - Revise Bylaws and BOD COP
- o Clarification that committee members would still need to attend SGC
- o A pro is that college reps would be supporting the VPAG and gaining knowledge of what's going on in each college
- utem IV.1.
  - o Defines what a college-specific committee is
  - o Ashley and Marcus compiling a list of all the college-specific committees
    - Colleges have different committees
- Academic senators would prefer to have a spot in the Cabinet
  - o To observe any overlapping issues between colleges
  - o An alternative would be having one Cabinet meeting where college reps focus on academic senator interests
- Through this system, issues could be easily brought to college administrators
  - o Reps make connections with people in their college
