> Anna Bing Arnold Child Care Center (ABACCC) Presentation – Time Certain 3:00 pm

ABACCC Speaker: James Goodrich

- The center's mission is to provide reasonable child care and counseling to parents, faculty, staff, and the community.

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- The center prioritizes student parents, offering reduced rates and job training, and has a waiting list of families.
- Mentions the accreditation by the National Association for Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and highlights center's commitment to quality care.
- The center's ratio of teach to children is 1:3 for infants and 1:6 for preschool, which allows for individualized attention and mentorship of student teachers.
- The center started in 1968 and expanded in 2003 with fundraising and grant.
- The center has difficulty filling spaces and relies on community events to attract students, while also ensuring they have enough funding to operate.
- Highlights ASI's role in funding the center and its legacy on campus.

### V. Discussion Items

➤ 2024-2025 Budget

Barnaby: Discusses budget cuts due to enrollment drop and increased costs, including personnel benefits and health insurance.

The committee permits and vouchers focuses on incentivizing student participation in committees – University Wide and ASI.

Barnaby: Suggests reducing committee membership costs by offering lunch or other incentives instead of paying per meeting.

The committee wants to engage students on campus, with appeals for parking and jumping in, and expectations for programming budget allocation.

Barnaby: Explains that the university is implementing club banking, which will provide \$35,000 to clubs.

The GIA budget was reduced due to changes approved by the student body.
