B. 2026-27 Recommended Advocacy Agenda

Jeffry: Shared this was approved at the final Legislative Affairs Committee and the purpose is to establish main areas of priority and goals that Legislative Affairs envisions as being the top priority for next year’s committee. In the committee they discussed what challenges that students are facing and how the committee could make the most tangible impact.

The first goal is to restructure and rebuild the committee by improving the efficiency and reach of the Legislative Affairs committee to train, empower, and advocate for students. Want to fill all of the at-large seats on the committee to make sure conversations and discussions are rooted and grounded in the experience of our students in their day-to-day life. Students can provide an outside lens of someone who is not super plugged into student leadership the way that ASI officers are. Want to engage them in a strong, robust training program and includes working with PBI and other local elected officials to develop training materials and workshops through our campus-based student government and through CSSA.

The second goal is to increase opportunities for students to be involved in our Legislative Affairs committee and other advocacy activities. Developing advocacy field trips early into the years, leading up to CHESS. Also, want to host an on-campus student leadership, advocacy, and political action conference that immerses our students into

the power of local government, getting involved in the community, and being civically engaged. Additionally, building stronger relationships with student organizations that are already doing the work like Political Science Student Association, Pre-Law Society, Political Science Department, etc.

Continued, want to institutionalize monthly updates from the VP for External Affairs on legislative work that has been done during the month and what is upcoming for students.

The third goal is to prepare students to be informed throughout the 2026 election cycle. Working to create a voter guide on what students need to know about voting. Collaborating with PBI and our external government relations leadership on campus for National Voter Registration Day and other voter registration outreach events.

Jeffry: Shared he had a meeting with some of the college deans and faculty to review applications for the Provost’s first round of seed grants. With the approved academic strategic plan the first step in implementing the plan is that the Provost had announced a pot of funding for some of the most important priorities outlined in the academic plan, including some professors are proposing 4 plus 1 degree pathways, which are changing some of our majors so that if you add an additional year, you'll graduate not only with a bachelor's, but with a master's as well. The initial meeting is to give the provost our rankings of the proposals.

Also, we turned in our final SFAC recommendation to the president - the recommendation was to approve the increases for both ASI and U-SU as both boards submitted their proposals and for the other proposals we declined those recommended increases for a variety of reasons. We asked the campus to return next year with additional information once they've done more diligence a bit more.

Barnaby: Spoke about the ASI proposal - we will be preparing throughout the summer with the new board to do a referendum in the Fall. We will keep moving forward and hopefully work with our U-SU partners do a joint marketing effort to promote both of the fees to the student body.

Jeffry: Shared we have set ourselves up to continue to push for students and make sure that students are being engaged transparently.

Genesis: Shared she has an upcoming meeting with PBI and Omar to finalize collaboration efforts.
