Who is invited to Eagle Fest?

All prospective students and their families. Approximately 2,500 guests are estimated to attend.

Are participants required to RSVP for Eagle Fest?

No RSVPs required. All are welcome to attend at any time during the event.

What is the purpose of Eagle Fest?

This event will provide prospective students and their families with an introduction to University life, academic information, and opportunities awaiting them at Cal State LA. Through the various activities, we hope to encourage students to apply to Cal State LA for Fall 2016 or in the future. This is not an event for students already attending Cal State LA.

What is my role in Eagle Fest?

To be the best Cal State LA Ambassador that you can be! Please share information about your program/department with the prospective students and their families. Answer any questions they may have, and provide them with what they need for a successful transition to the University.

What do I wear?

We encourage you to wear any Cal State LA gear you may have (not CSULA) Note it's expected to be a cool day so dress accordingly.

I will be part of the Information Fair, what time should I be there?

Please plan to check in at 8:30 a.m. at the University Club and have your table set up to go from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. The advertised event time for participants is 10 a.m., but experience has taught us that participants arrive early, that's why we are asking everyone to be ready to go at 9 a.m. The approximate ending time may be earlier than 2 p.m., depending on guest traffic. If you have your own department table banner, we encourage you to bring it along.

Will there be food service for campus representatives?

Yes. Coffee/food service will be available in the University Club beginning at 8:30 a.m. The University Club will remain open for the entire event; however coffee/food service will be available on a first come, first served basis. There will also be water stations along the Main Walkway.

What about parking for participants?

Parking will be free. Participants are encouraged to park in Lot 5, however, they can park in any lot except metered spaces or disabled parking spots (unless they have a DMV

disabled person parking placard or disabled person plates). Disabled parking is being reserved for Lot 4.

What is happening during the event?

Please refer to the event program for the event schedule and details about the day's activities. An Eagle Fest program will be distributed when you check in the day of.

Where do participants check in?

Check in is not required, however guests are encouraged to visit one of the Information tables for bags, programs, and drawing tickets.

Will there be food service for participants?

Yes. A breakfast burrito and drink will be provided to the participants attending. Lunch will not be served.

Will the Food Court be open that day?

Yes, food may be purchased from the food court from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m., as well as the My Delight Cupcakery truck (located on the North side of the U-SU) from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m.
