Glazer Family Dreamers Resource Center 2017-18 Budget – ASI Funding Request and Report

Cal State LA enrolls close to 1,100 undocumented students, there are about as many Dream Act recipients as well. This represents 8% of the student population according to Institutional Research data. The numbers keep growing, for the 2017-18 school year the Center for Student Financial Aid received over 1,400 Dream Act applications. The Glazer Family Dreamers Resource Center (GFDRC) exists to provide a safe and supportive community for students to excel academically as well as to develop leadership skills.

Students who are undocumented need access to resources in order to be successful in college and to graduate. Because they are not able to access any federal student aid including Pell Grants, Loans, and Work Study, they need scholarships and DACA grants in order to fill the gap. Many of these students come from families with very low incomes and little access to resources due to their immigration status, which creates a burden when paying for college. ASI funding in this case translates into direct support to ease the burden.

Cultural and social programming are important to leadership development; students wanted guest lectures; staff and faculty need ally training; among other needs. Because of the investment from Associated Student Incorporated (ASI, Inc.), students who are undocumented at Cal State LA were able to keep building a vibrant community including their peers, allies, faculty, and staff. This was accomplished through innovative programming and community building events that focus on intersectional identities as well as providing important legal aid from trusted attorneys such as Know Your Rights Workshops.


