

WHAT IS AN ASSESSMENT?

- Definition
 - Evaluation or estimation of the nature, quality, or ability of someone or something
 - Assessing the learning of something
- Types of Assessment
 - Formative Assessment
 - Interim Assessment
 - Summative Assessment



Learning Outcomes

A **learning outcome** focuses on "how students will be different because of a learning experience, the knowledge, skills attitudes and habits of mind that students take with them from a learning experience" (Suskie, 2009, p.117).

Formula for Writing Learning Outcomes:

Condition + SWiBAT + Bloom Word + What

EXAMPLE: At the ASI Open House students will be able to identify A.S.I. elected and appointed members.

Understand


