Facing the new year, as we ready ourselves for larger national and global shifts, A.S.I. is also undergoing a time of organizational change. Our Lobby Corps members continue to exceed expectations and advocate for you on the university, local, and national level. The College Representatives have played an integral role in bringing dynamic speakers, including NBC4 President Steve Carlston, to Cal State LA, while our Academic Senators represent the student voice on committees campus wide.

As an organization, A.S.I. is developing a 5-year strategic plan to chart and ensure our future success. While going through this dynamic process, we are also establishing new student success programs including the Zero to 100: A.S.I. Relaunch and the Life After College initiative. More information about these and other spring programs are on the pages that follow.

A.S.I. is transforming the way we operate and how we develop leaders within our Board of Directors, the Academic Senate, our Cabinet of Commissioners, campus committees, and the Screaming Eagles Street Team. 




