Spring 2018 Report: Fund Allocation Highlights

<u>Student Employment</u>: EPIC student leaders provide direct support to all areas of EPIC programing. On average, students are scheduled for 15-20 hours per week. EPIC employed 36 students during the 2017-18 AY. EPIC students benefit from student employment as they gain viable work experience, earn aid to help support their financial cost of attendance. The work EPIC students perform supports the engagement of thousands of students across.

The total projected student employment budget for the AY is \$160,645

<u>Community Service Volunteer Opportunities</u>: EPIC coordinates various co-curricular community service volunteer events for student engagement. An estimated 300 students are expected to participate across all events. The direct benefit to students is the personal impact that comes from their service, networking with peers, networking with community professionals, and the direct exposure to elementary school education.
