B. E. Certification of the Minutes

The certification of minutes for February 18th, 2026, February 4th, 2026, January 21st, 2026 and December 4th 2025 were tabled without a formal motion.

II. Public Comment: This time is allotted for the public to address the Council regarding items not included on the meeting agenda.

Arwa: Stated that tomorrow is Pizza with the Presidents which is an opportunity for students to understand the strategic planning process of the university.

Koi: Mentioned her event, Women is STEM Panel, in which there will be 3 speakers' panelists and for the first portion they will be sharing their experience in the field, after there will be a Q&A session, and then a networking portion. Additionally, the Career Center will be there to help students with their resumes.

Jeffry: Shares that him and Arwa had a meeting with the UAS Executive Director Tim Chang in which they discussed how the UAS is in conversation with the USU about turning Sbarro's into a campus bar or pub. Another thing they discussed is a themed happy hour; they just need to write a proposal. Mention that the collaboration with UCLA undergraduate student government for a virtual mayoral form is gaining some steam and will be sharing the updates in the following weeks. Also, mentioned he has a meeting with the University Library Dean in a couple of weeks.

III. Discussion Items

A. Spring 2026 ASI Student Forum

Jeffry: Will be meeting River that Friday and will send it through slack. Shares how they will be discussing budget, dates, and logistics for the town hall.

B. Academic Senate Updates

i. Major Discussions & Trends in the Senate

Jeffry: The Academic Senate Executive Cabinet had a meeting discussing a resolution that came up regarding the operational effectiveness, structure of the university with enrollment management being overseen in a different division than Academic Affairs. Asked if any of the student senator were consulted in the discussion.

Chase: It failed to be immediately moved to second reading

Jeffry: Asked if it would still be a first meeting item

Chase: Responded yes.

Jeffry: Asked if it was referred to any committee or if any admin was present.

Barnaby: Did attend but missed the conversation about the resolution and mentioned to focus on the resolutions at the end of the document.

Jocelyne: Explained that she understood it's a transition of realignment of office of enrollment management technology to enrollment management unit and says it's very vague.

Jeffry: Did some research and found out enrollment technology support it is own thing. Mentioned he spoke to Provost Lattimer Spoke and she talked about that there is sever understaffing and under-resourcing in the areas of this work - registrar's office and enrollment management services. Shared we can't make an assessment on all of this when we don't know what we currently have set up is working because we don't have the people in the positions that are doing it. Mentioned the academic course catalog on GET is one year out of date and is affecting the academic development of the students.

Barnaby: Believes this is interesting to look at as an exercise for the committee because everyone can draft a document demanding change but the only way to get change is by collaborating. The resolution was made because they said students were suffering but never went to talk to the student leaders about it. It was made up of a small group who approved it and expected change from it. Does believe there are some good points but thinks they should do it in an open collaborative way.

Jeffry: Agrees as they were not consulted and student voices were not really sought out for.

ii. Report from the Senate Executive Committee

Jeffry: Believes it was a productive meeting and was able to show them the draft of the student academic survey. The Senate Executive Committee provided some feedback and would like to have a conversation with them once they have the data. Talked about streamlining and strengthening the way we support student senators - provide additional resources, mentorships, and a more fruitful experience for student senators to make you all feel empowered to participate in shared governance.

Arwa: States that since the year is coming to an end suggested the student senators to think about how ASI should support you all as senators and how the Academic Senate itself should support you all (student senators).

Jeffry: Shared also how can this committee (Shared Governance Council) have a more proactive role in helping recruit students for university committees but especially Senate committees.

Jeffry: Shared for the next Shared Governance Council 3/18, inviting Academic Senate Chair Jessica DeShazo since student experience and training will be on the agenda she can listen into the feedback and also provide any Senate updates. Also, can be the meeting to invite some of the campus bargaining units so they can provide updates/hear from them. This is ASI's Shared Governance Council and it is a forum where other people on campus should come and share quick updates.

- iii. **Academic Affairs & Strategic Enrollment Management**

Jeffry: Shared has not determined what meeting for Provost Lattimer to attend but wants her to come and present on different academic trends and the statistic on campus. Also, wants VP Day to come and talk about enrollment. It could work if they can attend the same Shared Governance Council where they can provide some input and information on the new CSU student success frameworks as they align with our strategic plans on campus.

- iv. **Residence Hall Association (RHA)**

Jeffry: Shared for the Shared Governance Council 4/08, inviting RHA to give a presentation on how their association works, and how we can explore a partnership where maybe their president sits as a member on our Shared Governance Council since they represent the students who live on campus.

- v. **University Library**

The committee started discussing about the idea of inviting the College Deans to the last Shared Governance Council meeting on 5/06 and then we can provide them with Town Hall feedback and the Academic Experience survey feedback.

Jeffry: Shared his vision for this council is that ASI is the place where people on campus come to hear the student voices and making sure that the student voice is being represented well.

The committee started discussing the upcoming ASI Town Hall and the format of the event.

Jeffry: The idea of the zones is that we didn't want to make anyone feel like they couldn't share because of the time constraints and focus on a few important topics instead of many topics. The 3 zones are - Academic Experience, Social/Community Experience, ASI Visioning
